Dear Fathers, Sisters and Brothers,

Greetings from Bishop's House, Balasore!

I. MOTHER TERESA

The canonization of Mother Teresa, which would take place on the 4th of September in Rome, would surprise no one as she had been given the status of saint even before died 19 years ago. The 'Saint of the Gutters', as she was well known in the world outside, would finally be counted among the company of saints and placed on pedestals for veneration.

The poor for whom she dedicated her life need not be told that she is now counted among the saints of heaven. She knew that the true good cannot be found in systems and plans, no matter how clever and efficient, but in a person. She was not against the work of welfare agencies, but would remark that welfare was for a purpose, even though a noble one, but love was for a person. Mother Teresa offered love. When criticised by those who accused her of not going to the root causes of problems, she would simply remind them what the true root cause was. "The greatest disease today is not leprosy or tuberculosis, but rather the feeling of being unwanted, uncared for and being deserted by everybody ... The greatest evil is the lack of love and charity, the terrible indifference towards one's neighbour".

As we join the rest of the world in thanking the Lord for the gift of Mother Teresa to humanity as a saint on the 4th of September, let us prepare for that event in our parishes and institutions by way of conducting Novena and other fitting activities.

The Archdiocese of Calcutta is planning to have a related celebration on the 2nd of October. The details are awaited. Those who would like to participate in that event, may do so.

II. ANNUAL RETREAT 2016:

We shall have our annual spiritual retreat from 17th to 21st October in Bandel. Fr. Bobby, V.C. from a retreat centre in the North East will be the preacher. As the

annual spiritual retreat is obligatory for all the priests, please make alternative arrangements for your absence from the place of your assignments during those days.

III. ORISSA CATHOLIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION - AGBM

The Diocese of Balasore will be hosting the 31st Annual General Body Meeting of the OCHA on the 9th and 10th of August this year. The venue chosen for it is the newly Constructed Jyoti Hospital Auditorium. The theme of this year's meeting is "Action 2020: Repositioning for the Future; Strengthening our Hospitals, Health Centres and Care Centres". Around 90 representatives including those dealing with health care in all the Dioceses of Odisha, and officials of the Catholic Health Association of India (CHAI) from Hyderabad, are expected to participate in the event.

IV. DPP - THE DIOCESAN PASTORAL PLAN

Since both are seemingly incompatible, it is not easy to reconcile mercy and justice, but we as Christians must do that. "Mercy triumphs over judgment" (James 2:13), because mercy comes through judgment. The Church is commissioned to proclaim the mercy of God.

Parish priests and heads of institutions are requested to celebrate Justice Sunday Liturgy in a fitting manner. Please announce the event on the previous (Sunday, 14th August).

VI. APOSTOLIC NUNCIO

As per the information received from the CBCI secretariat, Archbishop Salvatore Pennacchio, the Apostolic Nuncio to India and Nepal, has been appointed Apostolic Nuncio to Poland. He would take up the new assignment in October, 2016, after completing 6 years of service in India.

We have fond memories of him, as he had been here as the Chief Consecrator at my Episcopal Ordination on the 30th of January, 2014.

We wish him all the best in his new assignment.

We do not have any information as yet about his successor.

I would like express my sincere gratitude to everyone who came to join the celebration of the Vianney Day on the 4th of August. A very special thanks to Fr. Job, C.M. for his thought provoking talk on the occasion.
